Background

The Division believes that students benefit from learning in a multicultural environment and that the inclusion of students from foreign countries enhances the learning experiences of resident students. Students from foreign countries living within the Division and wishing to enroll in Division schools should be given the opportunity to attend if space and resources are available.

Guidelines

1. Foreign and exchange students seeking admission to Division schools shall complete a registration form and must provide proof of legal name, date of birth, citizenship and residency status.
2. The decision to accept or reject an applicant rests with the Superintendent and / or designate and is subject to consideration of the individual circumstances of the applicant, his / her suitability for a program in the Division and the availability of sufficient room and resources to provide an appropriate program.
3. All foreign students will pay an annual tuition fee as approved by the Board. The rate includes a \$300 non-refundable application processing fee.
 1. On receipt of half the annual tuition fee and proof of legal name and date of birth, the student will receive a letter of acceptance from the Division. The student requires this letter for visa application purposes.
 2. The letter of acceptance and student visa shall be presented at the school upon final registration.
 3. The final tuition payment is due by September 30th of the school year.
 4. Tuition fees, less the \$300 application processing fee, and school fees are refundable prior to registration. Once a student is registered and has attended class, fees are non-refundable.
4. All foreign and exchange students are responsible for payment of regular school materials, yearbook, extracurricular and locker fees. These fees will be allocated to the school.
5. Tuition fees, less the \$300 application processing fee, will be split equally between the school and the central instructional “pooled” fund. The application processing fee will be allocated to the budget of the Coordinator of Alternative Education.
6. Additional fees for services such as home stay or residence placement, medical insurance and transportation will be determined by the Superintendent.

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7. Tuition fees will not be assessed for reciprocal exchange students. A Reciprocal Exchange Program means a recognized program under which a student who is a resident student of the Board is partnered or paired with a student who is a resident student of another province or country. The Division must receive the partnered student from another province or country either in the same school year or in the subsequent school year. The student exchange must be at no cost for tuition to the Division resident student enrolled in a school of the other participating jurisdiction.
